There has been a lot of building going on as we have had generous donations to upgrade or build rooms for the faithful staff at Rasper. The donation was specifically given for that purpose.

Sekai's family is growing, and it was really no longer fit to have them all sleep in one room, so an extension was added much to her delight.

Marion the tearoom manager, has supported her two widowed sisters and her family in two rooms for many years. Her donor has given Marion a brand-new home with furniture and repaired the old home for the sisters. Marion seems to work everywhere and is a great hand to Pastor Tafudzwa. She will now be able to host guests and bible studies.

Pastor Effrey, who had fallen on bad times and who we met several years ago living in a chicken coop, now has a good home with bedrooms for sons and daughters separate from each other with real beds. He and his wife are delighted with a living room and furniture to sit on to use for counselling, bible studies etc. Effrey is now the lead pastor at Parklands 2 community that we started in February. Just like Rasper the church has started with a small group. 8 people go to church regularly in an area under witch doctors and other beliefs. Rasper started with 5 and now have 3 church groups around Zimbabwe. Rasper church itself has over 200 members. Fear is being replaced by faith and hope

Another container from MEMO in Thunder Bay Onterio, will be arriving in Zimbabwe at the end of this month bringing much needed medical equipment for hospitals that are in

a desperate situation. Not only medical equipment but blankets and sheets, toys and school supplies and 1000 other things. It takes many people to fill a container and MEMO has devoted folk who pick up, sort, fix, paint, sort and pack. It is an ongoing job that never ends but all worth it. A packed container brings life and saves the lives of recipients. Dr Jerome along with his daughter have written the book below. I was surprised to read of all they have accomplished and how many containers have been sent out by MEMO You would find it an interesting read. It is available through Amazon in BC. Well done MEMO!! Where one container is arriving in Zimbabwe another is being packed in Victoria and will be leaving also the end of August. White Rock Baptist Church have given me a room to work in this summer. So much easier than trying to pack at home. Plus we have our house up for sale so nowhere to store all the boxes. The Victoria container is somewhat the same as MEMO with some medical supplies but also holds more of the everyday needs for schools and items for projects such as gardening tools for the gardeners. The men in the Tool department also put together specific tools for a carpentry shop, ie one carpentry shop is fully equipped at one time. also a team that put together specifically for sewing classes.

It works out so well between the two organizations they compliment each other. These pictures are of an older container but shows how they are set up in the projects
